## ASSOCIATIONAL MISSION STRATEGIST, TODD ROBERTSON Executive Board Report, April 27, 2026

During the previous quarter we have seen a number of churches on the move.

- After merging, GracePointe Baptist Church is now GracePointe at Beechland and has fully relocated to the former Beechland Baptist Church location. The GracePointe facilities in Valley Station are on the market for sale.
- Oak Grove Baptist Church has disbanded after Easter services following Pastor Rick Donaldson's retirement. They have gifted the church facility to Zion Cho Baptist Church, which has been a mission of New Cut Road Baptist Church.
- Sojourn Church Carlisle has also disbanded, and discussions are being finalized to transfer the building to another LRBA congregation (more to come).
- Two churches, West Broadway and Hillview have called new pastors.
- Several churches continue their search for pastors with a couple in the final stages of the search.

Also, this quarter I think I have had more numerous, deeper, and more challenging engagements with churches than any other time in my tenure. I consider this an evidence of grace. The Association is not here just to celebrate the good and easy, but to walk with churches and leadership through the challenging and difficult. Thank you for allowing me and the staff to serve through the hard stuff. Being more deeply connected relationally and connecting churches to churches, is where we see our Kingdom work flourish.

We are continuing to press forward to tackle several key things this year as an association. While the team and I will continue the everyday activities and services of the Association, here are a few big picture goals for this year:

- Reestablish an active LRBA Disaster Relief Team. Make plans to join us at the September training to be held at FBC Shelbyville. I will also be training the last weekend in April.
- Take first steps towards an effort that will focus on helping churches with unmanageable buildings and properties by securing them as Kingdom assets. Our facilities assessment process will be a part of this, and strategic partners will be a next step.
- Launch regional pastor prayer gatherings.
- Complete LRBA web redesign and story videos. The website is very close to being complete, as are the videos.
- Establish clear measurables for building and improving Intentional Kingdom Relationships

Thank you to all of those who attended the KBC Reach Conference and that were such an encouragement as I served as a plenary speaker. It was a joy to be able to share about some of the same things that we are striving for at the local level with leaders from around the state. It was also an honor to continue as a leader with the Associations In Megacities national AMS group and to special needs ministry training for the Crittenden Association.

Again, I remind you, we live in a broken world with hurt and difficulty. We pray over all these things. And we pray for each church to be a shining light for the glory of Christ no matter how hard it is.

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ,

The past quarter has been marked by meaningful pastoral engagement and encouraging opportunities for our churches to serve their neighborhoods with the gospel. I continue to be blessed by the faithfulness of our LRBA pastors and the creative ways that they are meeting the needs of their communities.

**MissionInsite** continues to be a valuable tool for helping our churches see and understand their mission fields. Over the past several weeks, I have had the opportunity to generate and walk through updated MissionInsite reports with multiple pastors and ministry leaders, including a side-by-side review with one pastor who had received a separate demographic document from an outside group. That exercise underscored just how comprehensive MissionInsite is compared to a simple radius-based demographic pull, as every question raised in the outside document was already addressed within one of MissionInsite reports. Churches that received MissionInsite reports in previous years are encouraged to request a refreshed report free of charge, as updated 2025 data is now available.

On the pastoral engagement front, I have continued meeting one-on-one with pastors across the Association to listen, encourage, and connect them to available resources. In several of these conversations, I have been able to present the LRBA Community Engagement Incentive Grant as a practical tool for supporting outreach efforts.

I am encouraged by a developing partnership with the Office of Violence Prevention through their Afternoons & Evenings of Peace initiative. This is a healing-centered effort designed to support Louisville communities impacted by gun violence, with churches serving as anchors of hope, connection, and resilience. Key components include survivor testimony, youth and family activities, food and hospitality, mental health and faith support, and outreach worker engagement. One of our LRBA churches will be taking part in this initiative at 6:00 pm on Juneteenth (6/19/2026) at Forest Baptist Church (4500 Petersburg Rd, Louisville, KY 40218). This is a promising avenue for other churches to consider as they seek tangible ways to bring gospel presence into neighborhoods affected by violence.

Please let us know how we can serve your church as you seek to make disciples for Christ. It remains a joy and privilege to walk alongside our churches in this important work.

These conversations have been energizing as I have strived to help church leaders move from a general desire to reach their community to a more informed and strategic approach to gospel engagement. It is a blessing to put practical tools in the hands of faithful pastors who are eager to serve the people God has placed around them.

One of the more unexpected ways I have been able to serve this season has been helping a few of our churches **develop and implement pastor training programs**. At the request of these churches, I have come alongside their leadership to help build out structured pathways for training and equipping their pastors and leaders for ministry. This work has been a meaningful reminder of what LRBA is all about—meeting churches wherever they are and however they need to be served. Healthy churches are built on healthy leaders, and we believe one of the most effective things we can do for the gospel witness of our city is to invest in the people God has called to shepherd His flock. It is a joy to come alongside these churches in that work.
